

Don Bosco is known to millions as brilliant educator and a great champion of the young. He was born on 16 August 1815, at Becchi, Turin, Italy, in a poor family and eventually he was ordained a priest. He dedicated his entire life for the welfare of the young. Don Bosco's system of education can be summed up in three words (3 R'S): Reasonableness, Relationship and Religiousness. A BRIEF HISTORY

Don Bosco College Mannuthy is an unaided institution affiliated to Calicut University started in the year 2005. The college is owned and managed by the Salesians of Don Bosco- a religious congregation of the Catholic Church under the Salesian province of Bangalore. The College is part of an International organization having over 39 colleges and a University in India and has 15 Universities and numerous institutes of Higher Education spread across the world.

The College is situated at Mannuthy about 7 km from the Thrissur Town. It is on the National Highway to Palakkad and is easily accessible. The Arts and Science College Mannuthy, which began with 3 courses and 82 students have today grown into a full fledged college with 12 Undergraduate and 2 Post graduate programs with a student strength of 800.

The College has secured NAAC accreditation with B+ grade, in the first Cycle, is one of the first unaided colleges under Calicut University to get this distinction.

The College aims to groom the youth into socially responsible persons by imparting intellectual, moral, psychological and social wellbeing.

Campus and Facilities

Don Bosco College, Mannuthy, situated in a serene and verdant environment, offers a tranquil atmosphere conducive to learning and personal growth. The campus is designed to foster holistic development, blending modern amenities with the natural beauty of its surroundings. The college operates in two buildings dedicated to Science and Arts respectively.

Academic Facilities

- Classrooms: All classrooms are well-ventilated and equipped with necessary facilities such as green/blackboards, platforms for faculty, desks, benches, sufficient lighting, fans, and Wi-Fi for ICT-enabled learning.
- ❖ Library: The central library features a Digital Library with computers connected through LAN, providing access to a vast range of learning resources. It accommodates 66 students and 32 faculty, offering separate reading facilities, a reference shelf, circulation counter, and more. The library houses 11,686 books, 21 journals, 21 magazines, and 5 newspapers.
- ❖ Laboratories: Modern, well-equipped laboratories with the latest equipment and software are maintained by faculty members and lab assistants for all programs.
- **❖ Auditorium:** A multipurpose auditorium with a seating capacity of 750 is available for joint sessions and cultural programs.

Technological Resources

Computer Labs: Advanced computer labs with high-speed internet and the latest software support IT and other technology-related courses.

- Wi-Fi: Campus-wide Wi-Fi connectivity allows students and faculty to access online resources and stay connected.
- ❖ IT Facilities: The college has 82 computers accessible to students and staff, with printers in offices, staff rooms, the library, reception, and the accounting section. Network security and risk management measures are in place to protect IT assets.



Sports and Recreation

- ❖ Sports Facilities: The college boasts two open grounds-one with a high-quality grass carpet for football and another for various games and athletic activities. Indoor facilities include badminton, table tennis, chess, and caroms. The gymnasium and yoga center promote physical fitness and well-being.
- Cultural Activities: The auditorium with a 750 seating capacity facilitates cultural programs. The Cultural Club encourages students to develop and showcase their artistic talents through college fests and inter-collegiate events.
- Various Clubs: Various clubs promote and motivate students towards extracurricular activities, organizing intra and inter-collegiate fests.

Student Support Services

- Counseling Center: Professional counseling services support students' mental health and well-being, helping them navigate academic and personal challenges.
- Career Guidance: Career guidance and placement services assist students in achieving their professional aspirations through workshops, seminars, and recruitment drives.

Community and Spiritual Life

- ❖ Chapel: A serene chapel is open to all students for quiet reflection and spiritual growth, regardless of religious affiliation.
- Community Service: Opportunities for community service and outreach programs instill values of empathy and social responsibility.

Infrastructure and Maintenance

- ❖ Power Supply: The campus is supported by the State Electricity Board, solar power generation, generator power, and UPS/ battery-based power conservation.
- Offices: The college administration includes offices for the manager, principal, administrator, vice-principal, IQAC, and college office.



Maintenance: Adequate human resources are appointed for maintaining campus infrastructure, including an in-house maintenance assistant, electrician, and plumber. Annual maintenance contracts and external security services ensure uninterrupted facilities.

At Don Bosco College, Mannuthy, we are committed to providing an enriching campus experience that supports the academic, physical, emotional, and spiritual growth of our students. Join us and become a part of our vibrant community dedicated to excellence and holistic development.

Library Facilities

The College Library, located on the ground floor of the Arts Block, is a well-equipped resource center designed to support the academic needs of both students and faculty. The library can accommodate 74 students and 16 faculty members, providing separate reading facilities for each group. The Property Counter and Gate Entry are conveniently situated near the entrance.

The library is automated using an Integrated Library Management System (ILMS), ensuring efficient management of resources. The new arrival display is positioned near the entrance to highlight the latest additions to the collection. Facilities within the library include a reference shelf, circulation counter, camera facility, reading room, periodical display, stack room, and a digital library section with eight computers.

The library boasts a diverse collection of 11,513 Books, 19 Journals, 16 Magazines, and 4 Newspapers. Additionally, it offers a wide variety of resources such as CDs, previous year question papers, project records, and coin collections. The collection covers a broad range of subjects, including Computer Science, Psychology, Christian Studies, Commerce, Management, Electronics, Social Work, and English and Malayalam literature. Books are arranged according to the Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) system.

Library rules and guidelines, features, online access for e-resources, resources, services, and working hours are displayed near the counter for easy reference. The library also maintains a special collection of



books for NET coaching, competitive exams, dictionaries, encyclopedias, yearbooks, and more. A newspaper clippings service offers insights into various college activities.

The library celebrates Reading Week annually, organizing various programmes to promote reading and literacy. Book exhibitions are also arranged periodically.

RULES AND GUIDELINES

The following guidelines are issued for the conduct of academic excellence and general behaviour.

- 1. The normal working day in the college begins with the roll call of the students at 8.50 am. This is followed by the class or morning assembly.
- 2. The Students are expected to report in the class room at 8.50 am for daily attendance.
- 3. The first bell will ring at 8:50 AM, and attendance will be taken at 8:55 AM. Students arriving after 8:55 AM will be fined Rs. 10 and must obtain a late slip from the designated staff member.
- 4. Students arriving late will be allowed to attend class and granted attendance until 9:15 AM. Upon arrival, they should proceed directly to class after obtaining the late slip.
- 5. Students arriving after 9:15 AM will not be granted attendance for the first hour. They must obtain a slip from the reception and wait in the library until 10:00 AM
- 6. Students shall always wear the stipulated uniform and identity tag throughout the academic schedule. No student shall enter the campus without their identity tag.
- 7. Loss of Identity Card must be intimated to the college office immediately, and a duplicate identity card must be procured on payment.
- 8. A fine of Rs. 50/- is levied if the student fails to wear any part of the uniform on any working day. Excuse can be given only by the Principal.

- Students shall park their two-wheelers in the allotted areas.
 Students are not allowed to bring Four-wheelers into the campus.
- 10. Consumption of narcotic drugs, tobacco, alcohol etc. is strictly prohibited in the campus and warrants disciplinary action.
- 11. Forming student organizations involving political activities are banned in the campus.
- 12. Posters, banners, flex boards or flags are not to be kept or exhibited anywhere in the campus except with the written permission of the Principal.
- 13. No student shall circulate notices, pamphlets, leaflets etc. in the campus.
- 14. Students are strictly prohibited from indulging in anti-national, anti-social, communal and political activities in the campus
- 15. Strikes, dharnas, gheraos, processions, shouting slogans, mass petitions, boycott of classes etc. are prohibited in the campus.
- 16. Every student shall handle the college property with care, thus maintain a sense of belonging to the college.
- 17. All serious or willful damage to any property caused by students will be subjected to restitution and face disciplinary measures.
- 18. No student shall solicit fund from students in the campus without the authorization from the Principal.
- 19. Access to or staying on in the college campus after normal academic hours is permitted only with permission from Principal.
- 20. No students can leave the campus during academic hours without the written permission from the authority concerned.
- **21.** Use of Mobile Phones is banned in the College building during working hours (8.55am 2.30 pm). If detected, shall be confiscated by the faculty members and returned at the discretion of the Principal after paying a fine of Rs. 500/-.
- 22. The entire campus is under CCTV surveillance.



- 23. Students participating in intercollegiate competitions should seek permission and carry the letter of authentication from the Principal.
- 24. As part of academic program, a two-day educational tour is permitted during the third year with the consent of the parents and the approval of the Principal. Two faculties should accompany the students for the tour. Any unwanted behaviour noticed or reported will have stringent punitive measures.
- 25. Any violation of normal academic environment is not permitted.

UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 2009

WHAT CONSTITUTES RAGGING:

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- b) Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which cause or generate a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or any other student.
- d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students
- g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;



- h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, social media posts, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicariousor sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to any other student.
- i) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

PUNISHMENT FOR RAGGING

The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely;

- a) Immediate procedure for FIR with local police.
- b) Cases will be reported to University within 7 days.
- c) Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- d) Withholding results.
- e) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- f) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- g) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- **❖** From the part of the college, necessary legal and other official procedures would follow any ragging incident.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Students should attend all the hours in the academic schedule.
- 2. A minimum of 75% attendance is required to appear for the university end semester examinations.
- 3. Attendance is taken every hour.



- 4. A student taking leave should produce leave form signed by their parents/guardian to the class teacher before entering the class when he/she returns.
- 5. Consecutive leave without information for a period of one week (5 working days) will lead to loss of admission.
- 6. Those who do not have 65% of attendance will have to apply for condonation from the University with medical certificate as evidence for leave. Those between 50% and 65% of attendance may apply for double condonation paying the prescribed fee and producing medical evidence. Those below 50% attendance will have to terminate the semester, and apply for re-admission in the same semester of the consecutive batch. The rules of the University are strictly followed in this case.

LIBRARY FACILITY AND GUIDELINES

- 1. Library functions from 08.30 a.m. to 04.00 p.m., Books are issued from 09.00 a.m. to 03.30 p.m.
- 2. The entry to the library is restricted to the only regular students & staff of Don Bosco College only.
- 3. Students should maintain absolute silence and seriousness in the library.
- 4. Users should keep their belongings in the property counter before entering the library.
- 5. Identity card is a must for all library transactions. ID cards are non-transferable. Fresh issue of ID card will cost Rs.25/-
- 6. Any loss of book or damage incurred by the student will have to be compensated as per library rules.
- 7. Students are allowed to borrow only two books at a time. Books shall be issued from the library during working hours only.
- 8. Books are issued for a fortnight and can be renewed only once.
- 9. A student failing to return the book within the prescribed time shall have to pay a fine of Rs.10/- per day per volume including holidays.



- 10. No member will be allowed to borrow books until the dues, if any, are cleared.
- 11. Any sort of marking or underlining on pages and removing pages of books are absolutely forbidden. Any damage or defacement of library materials is strictly prohibited and users found damaging material will have to follow disciplinary procedures.
- 12. Any violation of the library rules and regulations will result in disciplinary process including cancellation of library membership.

COMPUTER LAB GUIDELINES

- 1. Students should maintain silence in the lab.
- 2. Students should leave their footwear outside the lab.
- 3. No student is permitted to shift or interchange any part of the computer with another.
- 4. Students should follow the procedures prescribed for logging in and logging out.
- 5. Violation of lab rules will necessitate serious disciplinary action.
- 6. Any damage to any part of the System or furniture will invite compensation.

EVALUATION

- 1. Internal Assessment is held twice in a semester.
- 2. A student caught using fraudulent methods during internal assessment will lead to cancellation of that subject/s.
- 3. No student will be permitted to appear for the University examination without Hall Ticket and College Identity Tag.
- 4. Students found guilty of using unfair means in the University examination will be reported to the University and punitive actions will be taken as per University guidelines.
- 5. Absolute silence should be maintained in the examination hall.
- 6. Question paper should carry only student's register number and name.



- 7. Students must sign the attendance sheet during every examination.
- 8. The Internal Assessment consists of two Internal tests, Assignment, Seminar and Attendance. There is no provision for repetition or second chance in internal tests. Any one missing any part of the internal assessment will lose the specified marks.

FEE PAYMENT

- 1. Every student is liable to pay the prescribed fees for the whole semester within one month of the commencement of each Semester. A fine of Rs. 100/- will be levied for an additional period of two weeks. Further, a fine of Rs. 200/- will be charged for additional two more weeks. Failing which the student may be asked to discontinue attending the classes till payment is made.
- 2. Every student must obtain Non-due statement from the Library, Class teacher and the Office before collecting the Hall-Tickets for the examination. At the time of writing the University exams, the student should have cleared all dues.
- 3. Semester fee can be remitted at any branch of South Indian Bank Limited. Chalan Forms are available in the College Office. COLLEGE COPY of fee receipt should be compulsorily submitted at the College Office after payment. STUDENT COPY shall be kept with the student and be produced on request.
- 4. Admission is taken for the three year course. Once the payment of fees is made, it will not be refunded under normal circumstance. If a student wishes to discontinue the course for which she/he is admitted for whatever reasons, all the fees including the current semester the student is studying, should be paid for securing Transfer Certificate and other documents. Concessions in this regard will be given only by the Manager.



OFFICE PROCEDURES

- 1. Students should bring their ID card for receiving any services from the college office.
- 2. Issue of any certificates has to be done through a request letter together with a nominal fee of Rs.50/- for service charge.
- 3. Ordinarily, a notice of 24 hours is necessary for the issue of a certificate. Application for certificates received after 12.30 p.m. will be attended to only on the following day. It can be collected from the office, only from 1.45 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. on the following working day.
- 4. Application for Qualifying Certificates during the course shall be submitted in the office before 12.00 noon with a Deposit of Rs. 500/-. The said amount will be returned when the certificates are resubmitted to the office.
- 5. The Conduct certificate and the Proficiency certificate are documents which a student has to earn. It will not be issued as a matter of course.
- 6. Qualifying certificates submitted by the students on admission will be returned to them only on completion of their respective University Examination. They must be claimed within an year after completing the course.
- 7. The official documents submitted by the students on admission will be returned to them only on completion of their respective university examination or his/her TC being issued, but in no case during the course of study. If, however, a student requires his/her documents for producing it elsewhere he/ she will have to apply to the principal, clearing all dues as per rules.
- 8. After the completion of the course, transfer and course certificates will be issued to students. Students have to settle their dues before applying for transfer certificate.

- 9. Certificates are to be collected directly by the student. If a student is unable to collect them personally, he/ she should write a letter to the principal authorizing his / her father/ mother/ guardian. Duplicate TC will not be issued unless there is a certificate from an officer ordinarily not below the rank of a first class Magistrate to the effect that the TC has been lost irrecoverably.
- 10. The student has to retain all the receipts received from the college office, for any further reference or claim.

APPEALS / GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL

Any student having a grave grievance against anyone in the campus must in writing, report the same to those immediately in charge of the section. ie: Class Teacher/HoD/Vice Principal/Principal or the Manager. Grievances must be first handled by these persons and if they are not resolved, may seek the help of the Parent Teacher Association. Student leaders may assist the aggrieved student to report the matter to the appropriate persons if required. Student Union calling for mass appeal without first trying a solution at the various levels is not tolerated.

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
